It was through the vision of Mr Kenro Izu that AHC was built as he identified a need for a healthcare facility for sick and poverty stricken Cambodian children in Siem Reap. In December 2011 the AHC Outpatients Department (OPD) celebrated the treatment of its 1 millionth patient. It is a fantastic achievement to have provided care to 1 million children through the Outpatients Department (OPD).

On 19 December 2011, Alva, an 11 month old girl, came to AHC OPD seeking medical care. She was the 1 millionth child seen at AHC's OPD. Alya is the only child in her family. Her parents live in central Siem Reap.

Her mother is a housewife who cares for Alya at home and her father is a driver at one of the universities in Siem Reap. This is the third time that Alya's mother has brought her to AHC since she was born. Alya had been suffering from gastroenteritis for a number of days, so her mother decided to bring her back to AHC. Alya's mother said that she now only brings Alya to AHC, as she holds great trust in the hospital's medical team and staff. She recounts that each time she's brought Alya to AHC, the treatment and medications prescribed have been successful in resolving her problem.
