Many of you who visit Washington, DC have had the pleasure of meeting Sambonn Lek, bartender at the Renaissance Mayflower Hotel's Town and Country Bar. He is not only one of the Washington's most well known bartenders, but a great humanitarian.

Sam has worked tirelessly raising funds to aid the orphan children of his native country, Cambodia. Through his nonprofit charitable foundation, Sam Relief, Inc., Sambonn Lek has built numerous schools for Cambodian children who otherwise would not have had an opportunity for an education. He is responsible for the construction of sixty wells providing clean water to hundreds of families. Sam Relief, Inc. also provides these children with school supplies, eyeglasses, clothing, food, and medicine.
